We need to have our roses in front of people. Greater Cincinnati Rose Association has paved the way participating in their "Ault In Bloom" annual event. "Good on you guys and gals".

I also appreciate our district's expertise with people like Peter Schneider, Lou Shupe and Gary Barlow. And we can't give credit to folks without the name of Jim Hering who never says "no" when asked to help.

Buckeye District has the core to expand and become much more than it is today.

As I bow to you and the curtain closes on my active role in district events, I challenge you to greater outreach. Scripture tells us, "He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully.

In retrospect, we apparently haven't been very efficient sowers. I hope this message will resonate with all.

#### DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECT REPORT

Our District Director, Steve Campbell was unable to get to Shreveport for the June ARS Board Meeting because of mechanical problems.

District Directors Elect were invited to attend the ARS Board meeting June 3, 4, and 5th because of the online chatter of the Great Lakes District's inability to find someone to run for the position of District Director and the suggestion that the Buckeye and Great Lakes Districts merge. The merger idea was quickly squashed as ARS President Bob Martin explained the ARS Constitution and By-Laws. At the end of the ARS Board Meeting, Bob Martin approached me and asked what I thought of the proceedings and also informed me that the Tenarky District had the same problem when he became President of ARS. As I understand it, currently our incoming President Diane Summers, is working with Duane Dedene, the out going Great Lakes District Director to try to solve the problem.

A progress report on the ARS Great Garden Restoration Project and the Dedications of the new gardens-within-the Gardens was published in the July/August ARS Magazine. A more detailed report was given by Executive Director, Jon Corkern, at the ARS Board Meeting, June 3,4 and 5, 2021 in Shreveport.

In addition to all the improvements in the ARS Gardens and Klima Rose Hall mentioned in the article, the Maintenance Endowment Trust was used for a major septic system overhaul. The flooring in the Chapel was replaced and several roofs were replaced and/or repaired. Burglar and Fire alarm systems were added. A host of maintenance equipment was repaired or purchased. The irrigation and electrical systems were improved. Gravel was added to the parking lot and the phones and internet were updated.

The new 8 seater golf cart was a wonderful asset during the garden tours.

ARS Treasurer Jack Page and President Bob Martin, a tax attorney, helped apply for the Payroll Protection Program in order to keep the ARS staff during Covid.

The goal of the ARS Executive Director Jon Corkern, his staff and the ARS Board of Directors is to make the ARS Garden a self supporting, destination site in the Shreveport /Bossier City area. Plans are to be able to have up to three weddings/or events on the same day.

Other fund raisers include Christmas in Roseland. There is one huge Magnolia for which they are trying to get lights. They also have an Easter Egg hunt. Both events include food trucks. Their kids train was a big hit until it developed a problem. Plans are to try and repair it. The newest fund raiser idea is online educational events, so stay tuned.

I also learned that Jon is a former Boy Scout Executive from the area and is excellent at the job of getting local volunteers to help at various events/projects.

Jon also reported the March 2021 membership numbers



Edna Edwards – The Buckeye District lost another outstanding judge when Edna Edwards passed away this spring. She and her late husband, Dave, had been Accredited Judges for longer than I can remember, and they both progressed to Emeritus status when they returned from living in Florida. Edna and Dave were instrumental in the formation of and leaders of the Delaware Area Rose Society which meets at Willow Brook Christian Village where they resided. Edna is dearly missed by her family, friends and fellow rosarians.

2021 Fall Buckeye District Conference and Rose Show – The fall district conference and rose show will be held in Waldo on Saturday, September 4<sup>th</sup> at All Occasions Catering. A registration form including the schedule of events is included in this issue of *The Buckeye Bulletin* and there is **no registration fee**; please send it to me (email or regular mail) by August 25<sup>th</sup> since we need a count for the caterers. Our guest speakers will be Kevin Johnson and John Smith from Microbial Science Laboratories, and they will explain their company's products which are being used by some of our members. John will take orders for some of his exhibition hybrid tea introductions which will be available for December or March shipping, including 'Randy Scott', 'Claire Elyse', 'Baby's Blush', 'Sunny Sundays', 'Amy' and 'Kinze's Charm'. A copy of the show schedule is available on the Buckeye District website (buckeyerose.org) or from me by email. Rose show entries begin at 7:00 am, judging at 11:00 am and lunch at 11:30 am. The rose show will open at 1:00 pm, and the district business meeting and program will start at 2:00 pm.

<u>Buckeye District Challenge Classes and Trophies</u> – The Ad Hoc Committee on District Challenge Classes and Trophies proposed changes to the membership at the spring meeting, and they were approved. The recommended changes were described in the winter edition of *The Bulletin* and have been incorporated into the show schedule for the upcoming district rose show.

<u>Guidelines and Rules for Judging Roses</u> – The Guidelines have undergone a major revision, primarily dealing with disqualification and penalization, as described in the spring edition of *The Bulletin*. The revised *Guidelines* are now available for downloading from the ARS website (rose.org) and are in effect for this year's rose shows.

<u>Judging Seminar Requirement</u> – Because of the pandemic causing cancellation of rose shows and judging seminars, the four year seminar requirement has been extended to five years this year. You can see when you are due for a seminar by checking the Judges' Roster in this edition of *The Bulletin*. I plan to have a seminar next spring. We currently have three Apprentice Judges - Marian Wyman, Audrey Palumbo and Chris Brogan - and they and I would appreciate it if you would invite them to judge your local shows so that they can progress to Accredited status.

<u>Roses in Review</u> – The July/August issue of *A merican Rose* will contain a list of roses for us to evaluate this year and the instructions for submitting your review electronically.

Buckeye participation in this process last year improved from previous years, and I hope this is a trend. Each year the mechanism for submitting reports is revised and made easier. I encourage you to continue to be involved in this evaluation, or begin this year for the first time. Please submit a report even if you do not grow any of the roses on the list or grow only one or two.

Winter Protection – I would be remiss if I did not follow-up on a comment that I made in the fall edition of *The Buckeye Bulletin* regarding winter protection. I told you that I planned to cover a bed of 40 hybrid teas with concrete curing blankets. After the second hard frost I pruned all large roses (not OGRs, shrubs or climbers) down to about 12-14 inches and covered all roses with two to three heaping spade-fulls of hard wood mulch. Then I covered a bed of 40 HTs with #1 concrete curing blankets, applied plastic collars to a bed of 40 HTs and covered two beds of 40 HTs with rose cones. All of the other HTs and other roses had only the mulch. This spring, when I uncovered all of the roses, I could see no difference in the results from the four different methods of protection. All the canes were green, and I lost only 2-3 bushes in each bed. I will probably try this poorly controlled experiment again this winter since I have the materials, but only **IF** I have the energy.
