-- HORTICULTURE- RULES OF THE SHOW --

****** Notes ******

Horticulture Section A – Buckeye District Perpetual Challenge Awards are open to ARS Buckeye District Members ONLY. A correct and complete entry tag must be placed on each container. Challenge Class trophy winners are responsible to arrange and pay for the engraving of perpetual trophy(ies) and/or plaque(s) awarded to them and to return the trophy to the District Second Vice President or next show location the following year.

Horticulture Section B, Class 14 will be judged alphabetically. Each cultivar will be a separate sub-class.

- 1. The rules and regulations of the American Rose Society for the exhibition of garden roses shall govern this show. The rules are detailed in Guidelines for Judging Roses, with current information and corrections published in the AMERICAN ROSE magazine. (Point scoring: Form 25; Color 20; Stem & Foliage 20; Substance 15; Size 10; Balance & proportion 10.)
- 2. This is a computer tabulated show. Every person must be registered for the event and be assigned an exhibitor number. For couples, entries are permitted using either partner's Exhibitor ID Number. Certificates will be named according to the name or names listed on each entry tag. Any amateur is eligible to exhibit and need not be a member of any rose organization except as noted in special classes.
- 3. All entries, shall be received Saturday, September 4, 2021 from 7:00a.m. to 11:00 am. Judging will begin at 11:00 a.m. The show will be open to the public as soon as the judging is completed about 1:00 pm.
- 4. Horticulture and Photography Exhibitors will place their own entries on the exhibition tables and Arrangers MUST place their own arrangements in the designated areas. This is an alphabetical show with exception of Challenge Classes or as noted in class descriptions. All one stem entries will be placed alphabetically and each variety in each class

shall constitute a separate class. No exhibitor is permitted to move or touch entries other than his/her own. The show chairpersons may request horticulture, photography and arrangement exhibitors to move their entries after placement to create additional table space. Exhibitors will comply with all such requests in a timely fashion. All roses in separate containers must each have an appropriately completed entry tag including challenge classes.

- 5. Only judges, clerks, Rose Show Chairpersons and Arrangement Chairpersons are permitted within the show area during judging. Exhibitors not following this rule are subject to disqualification from the show. Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Rose Show Chairpersons.
- 6. Only American Rose Society entry tags shall be used. Both sections should be completed including section, class number, variety, name, address, and exhibitor number. Name labels or stamps and blue or black ink are permitted to be used on entry tags. Any entry which does not have assigned exhibitor number shall be disqualified regardless of whether the exhibitor's name is on the entry tag. Spelling of rose names must match ARS approved exhibition names and horticulture class. Misspellings will subject to judges discretion.
- 7. All Roses in specimen classes must be grown by the exhibitor or team of exhibitors in his/her outdoor, private garden.
- 8. Containers will be furnished for all classes as per Class Definitions. Exhibitor shall provide Floating Bowl Entry and English Box Entry, however show will attempt to provide glass bowls for persons who do not bring their own. Bowls will be provided on a first come, first serve basis.
- 9. Wedges of commonly accepted materials may be used, but must not extend above the top of the vase and must be used as inconspicuously as possible. A space must be left to allow watering of the entry.
- 10. Neither the Buckeye District of the American Rose Society nor All Occasions Catering is responsible for the loss of or damage to exhibitor property or prizes or for injury to persons attending the show. Liability of all nature is disclaimed.
- 11. For specifications not contained herein governing arrangements,

refer to the rules listed in the Artistic Design Schedule section.

- 12. All judges decisions will be final and not subject to appeal.
- 13. Each exhibitor or team is entitled to one half (1/2) table space in prep area.
- 14. All roses become the property of the show committee.

-- RULES FOR ARTISTIC DESIGN CLASSES --Theme: "VIRTUAL TRAVEL WITH ROSES"

- 1. Arrangement classes are open to anyone who is registered for the show. Designs must be the sole work of the exhibitor and no other person may assemble or alter the exhibition entry. All designs must have been created for this show; designs entered in previous shows are prohibited.
- 2. Exhibitors may place their designs between 7:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Designs may not be moved until the close of the show. Exhibitors may not move other entries. Chairperson may move entries if necessary.
- 3. Designs will be placed on neutral colored 3' deep tables. Arrangers may provide free-standing backgrounds if desired.
- 4. Care will be taken for all exhibits; however the BDRS, the host society or show facility will not be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit.
- 5. Roses must be the dominant flower in each exhibit, and must be correctly named on entry tag. Additional flowers and foliage are permitted unless stated in the class description. Do not use accessories unless identified in class description. Note special restrictions in Classes 11, 12, 13,14 and 15.
- 6. Arrangement entry tag must be placed by design and not under it. A 3" x 5" card may be placed by entry if needed for interpretive description and/or clarification.
- 7. All roses must be outdoor grown, but not necessarily by the exhibitor. However, to be eligible for ARS certificates the roses are to be arranger grown and correctly named, and marked or checked "AG" on entry tag. The ARS certificates are awarded to designs scoring 92 points or higher.
- 8. These are not permitted: a} painted or artificially colored fresh plant material; b) artificial flowers and foliage; c} live creatures; 4} the flag of any country. These are permitted: a} painted, man-made materials, such as wood; b) natural dried materials, such as leaves, may be used in modern classes and other classes, such as Duke, Duchess, Novice and Table Design. 9. The decisions of the judges are final. Judging follows the ARS Guidelines for Judging Rose Arrangements using the following score card:

10. A design must score at least 90 points to be eligible for an ARS 1st place designation. Only one 1st, 2nd, 3rd and honorable mention may be given in each class. In addition, the following may be awarded: One set of Gold, Silver and Bronze ARS Certificates {scoring 92 points or above} for standard, miniature and special designs.

- 5. Photographs must be no smaller than 5"x7" and no larger than 8"x10". All photographs are to be mounted (that is with a backing board of art board or foam board) and matted (the art board frame that goes on top of the photograph. Color of the mat is at the discretion of the exhibitor.
- 6. Exhibitors must completely fill out an ARS horticulture or arrangement entry tag and attach it to the upper left hand corner of the matting with a paperclip.
- 7. Judging shall be in accordance with the current ARS Score Card for Judging Rose Photography.
